
#### Pre-loved School Uniform

#### Nurserv

We've enjoyed an exciting week in Nursery! This week we have been exploring the story, Lulu loves Flowers by Anna Mc Quinn and Rosalind Beardshaw. We have been learning the rhyme; Mary, Mary Quite Contrary and we created our own character to use as a prop. In maths, we have been counting and matching different numbers of flowers to the correct numeral up to 6. We created some beautiful observational paintings of flowers. We are learning the names of the different parts of a flower. We are working hard to develop our co-ordination and balancing while moving through a challenging physical circuit. We are continuing to develop and extend our imaginations while participating in role play at the Garden Centre. Welcome to our new starters this week! Have a lovely weekend.

#### Reception

What a wonderful week of learning in Silver Birch. The children have been learning lots of interesting facts about ostriches. Some of the facts we learnt were they like to live in groups, they cannot fly and their eyes are larger than their brains. Ask your child if they can remember any other facts! Remember to come in to Silver Birch to see the children's facts hanging up. They are working really hard at applying their phonics knowledge when writing their ideas. In maths, we have been making arrangements with different 2D shapes. We had great fun creating animal puppets using card, tissue paper and wobbly eyes. We had fun on Friday morning completing different sport challenges with a partner. We were developing our throwing and catching skills, aiming and balancing skills. #### Year 1

We have had an exciting and enriching week in Year 1, filled with learning and exploration. In maths we explored the concept of half in shapes and objects. As part of our history lessons, the children had the pleasure of learning about David Attenborough, a renowned broadcaster who is passionate about caring for the natural world. The children were captivated by his stories and inspired by his dedication to preserving our planet's biodiversity. In science, we embarked on an exciting journey to explore the life cycle of plants. The children had the opportunity to plant carrots and sunflowers, observing first hand how plants grow and change over time. As part of our topic on Funny Faces, we embarked on an artistic adventure to the National Portrait Gallery. The children had a fantastic time exploring portraits and discovering different expressions and emotions depicted in the artworks. It was a memorable trip that sparked creativity and imagination. In R.E., we learned about Islamic celebrations, including the joyous festival of Eid al-Fitr and Eid-al Adha, the children explored the customs, traditions, and significance of Eid, gaining a deeper knowledge. #### Year 2

Good day to you, our wonderful Year 2 Parents,

It has been a delightful week in Year 2. We have sadly come to the end of our Power of Reading text in English, which was Rapunzel. However, the fun does not stop there. We reviewed the book for the author and the week culminated with us writing a re-tell of our story. In maths we also came to the end of our Volume, Capacity and Temperature block and we have started learning all about fractions. In geography we continued learning about Brent Cross and the different amenities that the area has to offer to its residents. In RE we explored different religious stories from sacred texts. In science, we continued learning about plants and what they need to grow. In art, we had so much fun making 3D flowers

Please read with your child for at least 15-20 minutes every night. This will help make a massive difference in their fluency and comprehension. Don't forget that Year 2 girls are swimming on Wednesdays so please remember swimming kits. Many thanks and have a lovely bank holiday weekend.

#### Year 3

We have been exploring our grounds in Wessex Gardens and looking at our topic on greenhouses in art and design. We went on a walk around our secret garden where we were able to look at our swimming pool and the structure that covers it. It looks very similar to a green house, only with translucent glass. In maths, we have been looking at fractions and adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator. In English, we have begun to write our letter to the pupils of Wessex Gardens inviting them to our chocolate factory to explore the grounds. In geography, we have been investigating the effects of earthquakes on human settlements. Can your child list the impact that earthquakes may have on human settlements? In science, we are finally seeing our plants sprout and it's so very exciting, we are keeping a diary of everything we can see during the growing process! #### Year 4

This week Year 4 have continued learning about podcasts in computing. They now know how to record, edit and link audio using microphones and the software, Audacity. In maths they've continued learning about how to use decimals and are making enormous progress in this tricky area! In English, they've been writing their own character's fictional journey using The Firework-Maker's Daughter as a structure. It's been wonderful learning how to tessellate shapes in order to create Islamic art designs. In science we've continued learning about habitats following last week's trip. It was such a treat to visit Clitterhouse Gardens. Everyone loved looking at the plants and thinking about how to classify them! In geography we've learnt about the different types of settlement and what services each could have. What a busy week! Enjoy your extra long weekend and see you all on Tuesday!

#### Year 5

The year 5s have been steaming ahead with using new SPAG terms, especially in their English lessons. They have been writing looking at text; reading aloud and re-reading text and sharing ideas. They have even researched on MI6, and held a debate about whether a teenager should become a spy. They have had a lot of fun in DT: Food Technology, learning about 'eating within the seasons; and in geography learning about farming techniques and practices, not just in the UK, but worldwide. The

students have noticed and seen the links between the two subjects. Great learning again from this year group. Well done.

#### Year 6

What a fantastic end to mock week. We are very proud of our year 6's for their hard work and resilience. They have been revising and implementing their knowledge and skills into their tests. We are looking forward to a week of revision next week, as we draw nearer to our SATS, which begins on the 13th of May. Please ensure the children are accessing Mathletics and SPAG.com, as well as the other revision sites we have provided them with. The children's mock papers will be going home next week, so that they are able to revise some topics at home. We have now finished our topics of classification and frozen kingdom and are excited to begin electricity very soon. Remember year 6, we are very proud of you, continue being fabulous!
